

***Rosyth Dinghy* - details**

Brief description:	The <i>Rosyth Dinghy</i> is a small (10 ft.) clinker-built rowing boat designed to be carried on RN ships as a general runabout. It was built by apprentices at Rosyth naval dockyard in ~1960. She was last carried by the RMAS buoy-tender, <i>Warden</i> , based in Pembroke Dock, and was given on permanent loan to the Society when that ship was disposed of.
